Adjetivos posesivos en inglés:

Los possessive adjectives son muy sencillos de aprender, veamos una lista:

My = mi / mis

Your = tu/tus

Her = su/ sus (de ella)

His = su/ sus (de él)

Its = su/ sus (de ello)

Our = nuestro/a nuestros/as

Their = su/sus (de ellos)

Como podés notar, en el inglés no hay forma en plural para estos adjetivos posesivos y cada forma tiene relación con un pronombre personal. Veamos dos ejemplos:

These are my books = Estos son mis libros.

I have my hair cut this morning = Me corte el cabello esta mañana.

En ambas frases usamos el posesivo de primera persona, "mi", pero si te fijas en la segunda hacemos referencia a una información un tanto redundante. En inglés es muy típico usar los adjetivos posesivos con partes del cuerpo y otros objetos personales

My

Este adjetivo se utiliza para indicar pertenencia a la primera persona singular (yo). Veamos algunos ejemplos:

My son is 6 years old – Mi hijo tiene 6 años

This is my new room, Amy – Esta es mi nueva habitación, Amy

Your

Utilizamos este adjetivo para indicar pertenencia a la segunda persona singular (tú).

I'm your father – Soy tu padre

Tom will be your partner in the dance contest - Tom será tu compañero en el concurso de baile

His

Se emplea para indicar pertenencia a la tercera persona singular del masculino (él) y se puede traducir al español como "su" y "de él".

Barcelona is his hometown – Barcelona es su hogar

Mark is washing his hands - Mark se está lavando las manos (fíjate que en español no usamos en estos casos el posesivo)
